Rev. Dr. Steve VanOstran Installed as ABCRM Executive Minister on July 13, 2008

Sunday afternoon, almost 100 people joined the ABCRM staff and Board members at the installation of Rev. Dr. Steve VanOstran as Executive Minister of this Region.

The service was held at Crossroads Church North Campus in Thornton, CO. Many of those that attended came from as far Wyoming and as the Colorado Western Slope.

Greetings were brought from the ABC-USA by Dr. Donald Scott (Associate Executive Minister and Minister of Mission Support of ABC of Indiana and Kentucky), Ms. Susan Gillies (Executive Minister of ABC of Nebraska), Rev. John Williams (Executive Minister of ABC of Central Region), and by ABCRM's own Rev. Dr. James D. Peters, Jr. (General Board Member).

The True Light Baptist Church Choir along with Brad Richardson of Crossroads, lead those that attended in some wonderful worshipful songs at the beginning and the end of

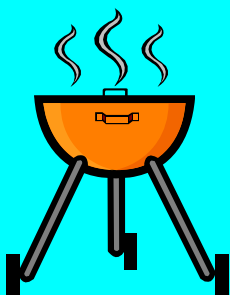

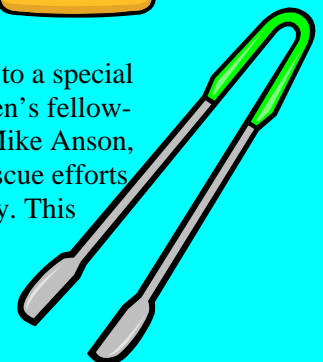

ABCRM Missions Team Completes Successful June 19-30 Trip to Bulgaria



Thanks to great support from our ABCRM special-interest ABC-IM missionaries Tom and Terry Myers in Sofia, a six-person mission team from Colorado and Wyoming successfully completed the June 19-30 ABCRM Missions Experiences trip to Bulgaria. Team members included Sherry Wilson and Karla Davis from First Baptist of Laramie, Kent Oakes from Calvary Baptist in Denver, and Dwight and Aladine Neuenschwander, and team leader Kerry Hassler from First Baptist of Boulder.

The Bulgaria mission team arrived in Sofia on June 20 and stayed in Sofia for two days to recover from jetlag. The team spent time preparing for the upcoming Guliantsi Vacation Bible School sessions they would help conduct and see a few sights around Sofia. They also met Pastor Teddy Oprenov of the Sofia Baptist Church—the Myers family home church in Bulgaria—and took a tour of the new SEBC church facility currently being built.

After attending Sunday morning services at the current Sofia Baptist Church, the mission team traveled to the northern Bulgaria city of Guliantsi with the Myers family and Bulgarian translator Katya Raichinova. Team members helped conduct morning Vacation Bible School sessions led by Katya from June 23-26 at the Guliantsi Baptist Church in support of Pastor Ivan Vassileff. The mission team enjoyed getting to meet and have fun with the over 20 Bulgarian and Roma kids who attended the VBS sessions each day.

During the afternoons in Guliantsi from June 23-26, team members worked at a nearby preschool to assemble new playground equipment, and paint playground equipment and the preschool's fence. The preschool director was very thankful for all the improvements made by our mission team, with a local TV station showing our work as part of

the evening news during the week. We also improved the grounds surrounding the Guliantsi Baptist Church by spreading gravel for a new parking area from Tuesday through Thursday.

On Friday, June 27, the team went to the nearby city of Pleven to assemble new playground equipment and paint a fence for an orphanage that cares for Bulgarian and Roma children of primary school age. We especially enjoyed meeting some of the orphanage kids who greeted us with big smiles and hugs.

The last Saturday of the Bulgaria mission trip was spent seeing sights in central Bulgaria with the Myers family and Katya, including the historic city and fortress ruins of Veliko Tarnovo—the medieval capital of Bulgaria—the quaint village of Etera with its many traditional crafts-making shops, and the beautiful “Shipska” Orthodox cathedral. The team returned to Sofia to again attend June 29 Sunday services at the Sofia Baptist Church. This was followed by a last-day visit to the beautiful Rila Monastery in southern Bulgaria that dates back over 1000 years. We sadly shared our last meal together with the Myers and Vassileff families along with Katya at the Myers' Sofia home on Sunday evening. All in all, our Bulgaria mission trip was a wonderful ABCRM missions experience.

American Baptist Leaders Endorse New Structure

Representatives of the General Executive Council gave a full presentation of the proposed governance structure for American Baptist Churches USA at the morning plenary of the General Board of American Baptist Churches USA.

The new structure eliminates interlocking mission boards but maintains interrelatedness through a Mission Table and Mission Summit held in conjunction with the denomination's Biennial Meeting. A notable difference is the process of selecting board members that allows for matching interests with board service and includes an orientation prior to commencing service. The denomination's commitment to diversity would be reflected in board members being selected from churches of different sizes and locations; across age groups, geographic regions, ethnicities, and economic classes; having differing physical abilities.

A proposed smaller board would reduce the expenses associated with holding meetings and administering the expansive mission of American Baptist Churches USA. In lieu of representation on a larger board, the Mission Table provides a means by which churches relate to the mission together, expressing their accountability along

with their intentions for ministry involvement.

The president of the Board of National Ministries, Annie Marie LaBarbour, said, "I think people have heard each other and presented a divergence of opinion to create the best possible product for this time. It is a platform from which to develop the denomination more thoroughly toward what is right for us in the 21st century. I support this proposal and believe it will support us as we move forward."

The Rev. Dr. James McJunkin, executive minister of the Philadelphia Baptist Association also voiced his support: "I want to move forward as American Baptists. The structure won't change what we do, we will. If I'm going to live out my faith through American Baptists I need to be diligent, sincere and intentional — I pledge myself to it."

While General Secretary A. Roy Medley is certain there will be "tweaking" of the proposed structure, he said "The General Executive Committee worked for the best possible process in making this recommendation." He commented on the careful balance being struck between autonomy and interdependence.

"The current structure has bound us up in some ways. But in moving toward autonomy, we keep the interdependence that we value as well. We're American Baptists before we're regions or national boards. We are first and foremost 'us'."

Mary Armacost Hulst, president of the General Board, said, "My local church in the new structure would be taken seriously. We would have a very strong voice that is central when we gather together to suggest ideas and implement ideas and vision for the denomination. Actually, representation could be even broader than it is now." Hulst said the Leadership Pool is a database that will be kept current and used to bring in representation from the local churches. "All of the boards combined would give the representation," she added.

Dr. Reid Trulson, executive director of International Ministries, called the structure a "federation model" that he believes will position American Baptist Churches USA for the greatest impact in missions in its cultural context. "The central principle we observe in global mission is the need to understand the culture and to take appropriate actions," Trulson said.
