Our State Project is for the Karen's (pronounced ku renn). ABCRM is also focusing on the Karen's and their new church start. The Karen's are refugees who are fleeing the persecution in their homeland. Most arrive with nothing but the clothes on their backs. The Karen's are American Baptists who can trace their families back to American Baptist missionary Adoniram Judson. They are our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Who can know what your gift to the Colorado State Project will do for the cause of Christ. God uses us to further His kingdom. The following story illustrates a way God used one person.

During World War II our father was privileged to serve as Chaplain in India and Burma where he visited as many missionaries as possible. I remember him talking about the Karen, Kachin, and Chin people groups in particular.

He missed his family terribly. Dad was drawn to two little girls who were unable to attend school because they didn't have the required clothing. Having found out the amount of fabric needed to make a "sari", Mom sent enough material for four, one to wash and one to wear for each girl. I remember how she lovingly put that package together. And then how upset she was to find out that the girls had givehalf of the fabric to two

other girls. Mom didn't understand the culture. But, four girls were able to go to school.

Our folks kept track of the girls, sending small gifts for Christmas, Birthdays and occasionally at other times and generally encouraging them in their studies. One of the girls went on to become a nurse.

Chhaya continues the tradition today by financially helping children in her neighborhood go to school. A small act of kindness has helped many people. We won't know what these children will do with their lives but God knows.

I have a recent picture of Chhaya holding her Bible standing in front of her humble home. When I see her picture each morning I am encouraged to know that God honors that which we do in His name.

This is an exciting time in which to live. God has given us so many opportunities to witness for Him. You ask, "I'm only one person. What can I do?" Consider just a few of the ways you can be involved:

- * Streets Hope (a recipient of "Break the Chains" grant) led by Kathy Bird DeYoung
- * White Cross – our missionaries need our help (even one item helps)
- * Love Gift – a portion of the funds return to Colorado
- * Colorado ABW State Project – Karen's Project
- * Retreat in Feb. 19-21

As you get up in the morning, thank God for giving you another day to witness for Him. Then ask Him to guide you to your challenge for that day.

Ideas for a Vital Women's Ministry

1. Discover your leadership style

Think about women you know that are leaders. Each brings a distinctive style to leadership.

- ♦ Gregarious or outgoing women typically lead through a cheerleading, you-can-do-it style.
- ♦ Strong-willed women bring a direct and opinionated get-the-job-done style of leadership.
- ♦ Easygoing personalities offer a steadiness and a calming approach.
- ♦ Reflective personalities offer good, solid information for those they lead.

You have permission to do it your way. There is not just one way to lead. Be yourself. Lead the way God created you to lead.

At a "Kollege of Knowledge" activity at American Baptist Women's Ministries' 2009 National Women's Conference, the above idea sparked discussion of additional leadership styles that include Listeners, leaders who Delegate, and Relational leaders.

2. Pray, pray, pray

One women's ministry began 15 years ago with 3 women who met regularly for prayer. They had seen the diversity of needs among the women and longed to find a way to address them. They simply prayed that God would make a way-and they continued to pray for 3 years before a door finally opened.

3. Mutual Invitation

In order to ensure that everyone who wants to share has the opportunity to speak, use this process:

- ♦ The leader or a designated person will share first.
- ♦ After that person has spoken, she then invites another to share. Who you invite does not need to be the person next to you.
- ♦ After the next person has spoken, that person is given the privilege to invite another to share.
- ♦ If you have something to say but are not ready yet, say "pass for now" and then invite another to share. You will be invited again later.
- ♦ If you don't want to say anything, simply say "pass" and proceed to invite another to share.
- ♦ Do this until everyone has been invited.

5. Pay Attention

Become an eavesdropper. Anytime women gather, listen. Pay attention to their conversations and their laughter. Pay attention when someone is expressing passionate feelings or concerns – any concern. Are they discussing caregiving stressors, challenges with teenagers, or grief issues? Are they expressing unmet personal needs or noting needs around them? What's uppermost on their minds? A key element of building a ministry to women is connecting with women where they live.

Investing in Women/Girls Leadership

What we do with our resources is important to God. We are the incarnation of Jesus on the earth. We are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. All of these statements are accurate, but have you ever wondered how to bring those statements into practicality? According to the ABCUSA website, here is one example of an American Baptist Women's Ministries grant recipient.

NightLight Ministry, directed by Charity Marquis, an American Baptist woman in Los Angeles, CA, will use a second year grant for its expanding outreach ministry. A goal of the organization is to mobilize community members to recognize instances of human trafficking and to take action. Training and street outreach are integral to this project. NightLight has been a pioneer in organizing direct street outreach to potential trafficking victims in Los Angeles.

American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM) is on the frontline as this ministry example bears witness. ABWM provides leadership training for women leaders and future women leaders to worship God, grow spiritually, develop their spiritual gifts, care for one another, and reach out to others. Who knows – maybe one of those leaders in training will be the leader of an organization such as NightLight Ministry?

One way we can help to develop and invest in leaders is through participating in the 60th Anniversary Endowment Fund to help women and girls within the ABCUSA. "Your gifts to the endowment Fund Campaign will help ensure that vital ministries with women and girls continue in the future." These funds will help provide training and resources for women such as Charity Marquis to provide ministry by being the incarnate hands and feet of Jesus.

When you invest in the 60th Anniversary fund, you are investing in the lives and leadership of women and girls that may not have the opportunity otherwise. The monies go to train our current and future leaders for mission and ministry. What is a better opportunity to encourage others to be salt, light, and the incarnate presence of Jesus by our support in the endowment fund?

As I was writing this, I thought out how the ABWM has invested in my life. I would encourage the reader to examine her life and see how ABWM or a female role model invested in their life to make her the leader she is. I would personally like to thank the American Baptist Women's Ministries for providing leadership opportunities for me such as the scholarships for seminary and the scholarship to attend the National American Baptist Women's Conference to learn more about our wonderful American Baptist Women Ministries. Let us provide an opportunity for our American Baptist Women's Ministries to continue molding and growing leaders by giving to the 60th Anniversary Endowment Fund.

A Devotion from the Personal Development Ministries Coordinator

Many of you from conference may recognize my name as I volunteered to be the Personal Development Ministries Coordinator at our meeting in Grand Junction. I am LaRose Karr from First Baptist Church in Sterling, Colorado. We are hosting the annual state conference next year at our church. Here is a little bit of information about me: I work for the State of Colorado as an Administrative Assistant at a Correctional Facility. It's a family thing for us to go to prison. My husband is a Sergeant and my daughter is also a Correctional Officer. I am mother to four adult children, three of which are working on college degrees. Two of my children are married and one is promised. I am also a free-lance writer and have devotions and short stories published in books and devotional guides.

My first real task as Personal Development Ministries Coordinator was to lead "Worship" time on Saturday morning of last week at our State Board Meeting. I am sharing with you in this article the devotion that was presented to our State Board last weekend. God's word is always new and refreshing. I'm looking forward to a great year with American Baptist Women's Ministries. May you be blessed and be a blessing to others as we serve God together.

WORSHIP

There are 98 verses in the bible referencing worship. 62 of those are found in the Old Testament. Many of the Old Testament verses refer to worshipping false gods which we know is not pleasing to God. 36 verses regarding worship are found in the New Testament.

What this tells us is that worship is important for God's people.

I sometimes think about nonbelievers who do not attend church anywhere. How do their spirits survive without music and singing to the Lord?

The King James Version is a beautiful bible translation full of wonderful word pictures and it says this in I Chronicles 16:29: Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name: bring an offering, and come before him: worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness.

There are four elements of the scripture that I want us to look at:

1. Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name – This is not something that we should take lightly. The Lord is due the glory unto his name. He is a God deserving of the glory we can give to him in word, song, and everything that we can pour out to Him in worship. He is faithful, holy, true, wonderful counselor, mighty God, Prince of Peace.

So give unto the Lord, the glory due unto his name.

2. Bring an offering – First off I think we probably envision an offering of money, but our Praise is also an offering. I couldn't help but think of Abraham. Remember Abraham was willing to give his son Isaac as an offering until an angel of the Lord intervened. The bible says then in Genesis 22:13: *And Abraham lifted up his eyes, and looked, and behold, behind him a ram caught in the thicket by his horns. And Abraham went and took the ram, and offered him up for a burnt-offering in the stead of his son.*

We don't offer burnt offerings today because there's no need since Jesus died on the cross for our sins and is interceding for us. But ladies, if we did offer burnt offerings what would they be? Just as Abraham, what "would we" be willing to give up?

Since I work in a prison a lot of the people I come into contact with are not Christian. You can tell by a person's behavior if they know Christ. And the opposite is true of us. People should identify us with Christ by our behavior. I want to be willing to give all those traits over to God that do not glorify him. So maybe we should be willing to give him some burnt offerings! What about giving up pride, anger, jealousy, rudeness, rage and all the many things that plague our human lives on a daily basis?

3. Come before Him – that means we have to come into his presence. We must enter a time of oneness with God to enjoy Him and just take delight and pleasure in Him. It is his desire we find joy being in his presence.

There have been times in my life when I pray to the Lord and I ask this question, "Lord, can I just sit in your presence?" And when I do that I don't have to expend energy feverishly praying over the turmoil I feel. I sometimes just want to experience His presence.

4. Worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness – Isn't that a wonderful phrase? "**The Beauty of Holiness.**" This tells me holiness is desirable because there is beauty in it. Beauty is described as **the quality present in a thing or person that gives intense pleasure or deep satisfaction to the mind.** When we worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness, we gain intense pleasure and deep satisfaction to our minds.

Today I encourage you to find unique and different ways to worship the Lord.
