#### **Mission and Service**

First, our proposed State project for 2018 - 2019 will be Puerto Rico. We believe that although the National Project for Baptist Women's Ministries in Puerto Rico is taking place this year, we felt that it would be beneficial for us to make it our State Project for 2018 - 2019. Our Baptist sisters in Puerto Rico are going to continue to need our help. They have generously supported American Baptist Women Ministries through the years and now it's our turn to support them. Our goal is to raise \$2,000, but I have faith that as a state, we can raise more.

Our State Conference project is helping the homeless. In the box below, you will see a list of items that can be brought to the Conference. You choose the items that you would like to bring. I will collect them and we will sort them and put them into one gallon bags to be handed out to the homeless. We can either give them out individually or give them to a shelter. My hope is that each church represented will bring some of the bags home and continue this ministry in their own city or town.

#### **Treasurer**

I've noticed that many ABWM groups in Colorado are financially active in the spring, and that's worth celebrating!

One ABWM group held a bake sale last month to raise money for this year's State Project ("Meals for New Life Center Girls"). Their gift was sent to me, deposited and it has already been forwarded to our American Baptist missionary in Thailand.

Another ABWM group sent a check last week with a request that it be used partially for the State Project, and partially for National Support and for our Colorado ABWM. As Treasurer, I'm delighted to allocate the funds as you direct!

During the Retreat held last month, monies were given for Love Gift, and those monies are being sent to American Baptist Churches of the Rocky Mountains (ABCRM) to be administered there with other Love Gift offerings.

From past experience, I know that additional generous gifts from local churches or from active Associations will reach my mailbox in the next two months. If your Association is active, please make sure your local gifts reach your Association treasurer before April 30<sup>th</sup>, so that she can send those funds to me and I can distribute them as directed in May. If your Association is not currently active, your local church group can send its gift directly to me, preferably by the first week of May.

If you have Love Gift monies, those should be sent directly to American Baptist Churches of the Rocky Mountains, rather than to me.

# **Scholarship**


Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus
